The ministry of Quaker Haven has been expanding over the past five years both in the number of youth and families served and the types of retreats and programs. In addition to youth camps and church retreats, we also serve elementary, middle, high schools, colleges and homeschool groups. We offer Christmas and Easter programs, and programs for climbing, fishing, outdoor survival, and nature study. The size and style of facilities that can offer year-round accommodations and foodservice have attracted more groups than we can serve. It is our mission to have Quaker Haven as occupied as possible to impact as many lives as possible for building the Kingdom.



The camp has always relied on donors to make growth possible and to fuel the established ministries. As we approach 2020 we ask you to partner with Quaker Haven financially. As always, donors close the gap in the ministry budget at year-end but we are also asking for your help to finish the Duplex staff house. The Duplex is being constructed to adequately care for the dedicated staff who give their time and talent to offer the programs, care for guests and maintain the facilities. The decision to build was based on the needs of the staff, the lack of nearby adequate housing for



growing families and the financial advantage to camp in the long-term. Generous support has already been received to this point, but to finish the construction this year, we need to raise the last \$20,000. Your gift this year will help Quaker Haven continue to grow and thrive in its ministry to create opportunities for God's people to rest, encounter Christ, and respond.



Note From Program Director Kevin Lipsey:



Quaker Haven Camp isn't busy with programming just during the summer. We offer many opportunities for youth to experience camp throughout the year!

theWILD-This is a special wilderness survival program designed to teach the basics of surviving in the wild: shelter, fire, water, and food, then relating these skills back to everyday life. We have been working with Teen Court of Kosciusko County, helping to redirect first-time offenders. Rather than sending them to juvenile detention, the court sanctions them to complete one of several programs including theWILD. We will reconvene this program the end of February.

Climbing Club-Currently, we offer three 6-week sessions. We not only teach kids how to climb with the proper technique, but also skills for leadership, problem solving, and communication.

School Groups-We are a field trip destination! We have hosted 4th-6th and 9th graders here at camp. With one of our groups the teachers do most of the sessions but with our other groups we do the full program. Kids are able to go boating, rock climbing, learn about Native Americans, and much, much more.
